4,000
BABIES ARE BORN TO TEEN MOMS EACH YEAR

67%
OF PARENTING TEEN MOMS LIVE BELOW THE FEDERAL POVERTY LINE

IN COLORADO, A SINGLE MOM WITH ONE CHILD MUST WORK OVER **80 HOURS** PER WEEK AT MINIMUM WAGE TO REMAIN ABOVE THE FEDERAL POVERTY LINE



LESS THAN **1%** OF TEEN MOMS WILL EVER GRADUATE FROM COLLEGE, AND FEWER THAN HALF WILL EARN THEIR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA
